NHS England and Wales Drug Tariff Online

The <u>NHS England and Wales Drug Tariff</u> is available online three working days before the end of each month. All contractors are notified of its publication by email on the first day of each month.

You can view the Drug Tariff in one of two formats: a PDF version (which closely resembles the traditional printed version) which you can download onto a mobile device and does not require constant internet connection. Selected

The 'electronic' version can be viewed on a variety of devices but does require a constant internet connection. This version does not contain page numbers and any reference to page numbers should be cross-referenced with the PDF.

<u>User guides are available</u> detailing how to use both versions.

We have also broken down the PDF Drug Tariff into sections frequently used by contractors. You can view Parts VIIIA, Part VIIIB, Part VIIID and Category M drugs in separate <u>Excel spread sheets</u>, as well as appliances listed in <u>Part IX</u> of the Tariff. <u>Concession prices</u> and any <u>Serious Shortage Protocols</u> are also published when they apply, and any other changes to the monthly Tariff are communicated in the <u>Pharmacies</u>, <u>GP practices and appliance contractors</u> <u>news</u>.

<u>Hypromellose 0.3% eye drops - Drugs changing to Appliances</u>

There are occasions where licensed medicines are discontinued but medical appliances are still available. A recent example is Hypromellose 0.3% eye drops which was removed from Part VIIIA of the Drug Tariff in June 2022 but is still listed in Part IXA.

This type of appliance should only be prescribed by brand. Please see the Eye Drops – Hypromellose section of Part IXA of the drug tariff for listed brands.

If any generically written prescriptions are received, these will be passed for payment where a listed branded appliance from the drug tariff is endorsed.

Any unendorsed submissions will be referred back.

If a brand not listed in Part IXA of the Tariff is endorsed, the item will be returned as disallowed.

We have recently noticed a rise in Disallowed items.

A high percentage of Disallowed items are those ordered by dentists or community nurse prescribers which are not listed in their respective drug formularies or are an appliance or chemical reagent that is not listed in Part IX of the Drug Tariff.

To help reduce the number of times this happens, we have put together a guidance document on some of the most common Disallowed items and the reasons they were Disallowed.

Endorsing Serious Shortage Protocols (SSPs)

If the Department of Health & Social Care (DHSC) decides there is a serious shortage of a specific medicine or appliance, they may issue a Serious Shortage Protocol (SSP).

Under an SSP, pharmacists have the power to dispense an alternative to a prescribed medication, without first having to contact the patient's GP.
